

Mr. Mazhar Mallouhi gave me a copy of the book “The True Meaning of the Gospel of Christ”, and when I read this book innumerable important truths from the beginnings of humanity until the emergence of Islam were made clear to me. Among the truths I discovered in it, for example, is the topic of Christ being the Son of God. This term is one which we are not accustomed to, and all of us along with many other people think that the Lord Christ (his peace be upon us) came into this world as a result of a sexual act. Mr. Mallouhi explains the truth that all of us belong to our home towns, so for example I am from the Province of Babel in Iraq, and therefore I am Babylonian. When the Lord Christ says that he is the Son of God, he means that he belongs to God, and has not come to this world through sexual reproduction or the mating of a man and a woman. As for the term “the only Son of God,” it refers to the fact that the Lord Christ is the only person who has come into this world apart from the mating of a male and a female, and therefore he is called the Son of God, because he is the only one who has come into the world in this way. He is not the Son of God through biological reproduction or the like. As a result of my knowledge of Christ I have now been inspired to write these verses of poetry for Arab readers:
